



# Year 5 & 6: Autumn term 2017

## Title: Conflict

### Communication Language and Literacy

Key Text: 'I survived the Nazi invasion' by Laura Tarshis

We will be using the text as our stimulus for writing about the events during World War 2.

We will be analysing the different characters within the text and will be writing character descriptions about them. Taking on the role of the different characters we will be writing letters, recounts and examples of written speech.

Through our learning of World War 2 we will be researching, note making and writing factual reports about what life was like during that time and we will be holding class discussions and debating about the rights and wrongs of going to war.

#### ICT:

We will be developing our ICT skills to research and then present our findings about World War 2.

We will also be learning about apps and designing our own.

### Physical Development and PSHE

#### PSHE:

We will be following our new Jigsaw scheme with the new focus being on celebrating differences.

PE: We will be working through the Real PE curriculum which looks at the skills used for ball games (passing, catching, balancing, and hand-eye co-ordination) and playing games.

Please remember to have PE kit in school on a Thursday and a Friday. (All PE kit must be named)

### Knowledge and Understanding of the World

#### SCIENCE:

We will be learning about electricity and learning what parts are needed to make a complete circuit. We will also be using the scientific symbols for all of the different components. This will take us on to sending coded messages using light and sound.

#### HISTORY:

We will be learning about life in Britain during World War 2. We will be making comparisons and identifying contrasts between then and now. Using primary and secondary sources we will learn about the effects that the war had on people, such as children who were evacuated, as well as the buildings and local area of Rushden. We will end our learning with a V.E. party to celebrate the end of the war.

#### GEOGRAPHY:

We will be identifying the countries who were involved in the war and locating these using maps. We will be mapping the routes that some of the British troops took as they were sent to the battlefield and we will consider the advantages and disadvantages of battle based on the landmarks and landscape of the area.

#### RE:

We will be learning about why ritual and celebration are important to people, focusing on the religion of Hinduism, we will learn about the traditions and customs that this religion celebrates.

### Creative Development

We will be making games and toys for children during that time under the 'Make do and Mend' philosophy. We will also be making biscuits when we look at rationing. Within our artwork we will use mixed media as we use the poppy as our stimulus when we celebrate Remembrance Day. We will also be creating bunting and invitations for our V.E. Day celebrations.

### Mathematical Development

The four operations: The main focus at the start of this term is on using methods to add, subtract, multiply and divide. After that we will be learning about fractions including how to add and subtract them.

We will:

- Practise traditional methods of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- Complete a range of word problems focusing on the four operations.
- Look for common multiples when finding equivalent fractions.
- Add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions.

We will be continuing to practise our times table knowledge through our daily Rock Star Maths challenge. Further practise of the skills taught within school will be set on MyMaths for pupils to try at home.

### Enrichment

We will learn first-hand about what it was like during World War 2 as we listen to audio tapes and written documentation of people describing their experiences during this time.
