Children in Need

On Friday 17th November the school took part in Children in the Need. Throughout the day classes took part in a range of activities to explore the work of the charity and society beyond our community. The Pupil Forum helped to arrange a cake sale and the children all came to school in spots for a 'Spotacular' day. The generosity of our community was amazing and we thank you all for your incredible support. As a school we raised a profit of £402, which makes me incredibly proud.

Forest Points

In a Monday assembly we also celebrate our hard work in lessons and the forest points we have been earning for our teams. Forest points are given out for a range of reasons including use of manners, positive behaviour choices and learning behaviour choices. This week's results were:

Attendance

Our current whole School Attendance is 95.89%. Our target is to be at 96.5% or higher at the end of year. In a Monday assembly, we celebrate the class with the highest attendance. This week's results were:

2nd Place—Owls with 97.86%

3rd Place— Badgers with 97.14%

As the winter weather hits we know children get ill. We have spoken to all of the children about the importance of washing their hands, using a tissue and putting it in a bin, and covering their mouths when they cough to help reduce the spread. Our site team have also increased their cleaning regime and they now come in during the day to clean down door handles and common surfaces to also help prevent spread. This is in addition to their normal routine.

Foundation Stage

The children have been using their phonic skills to write invitations and they have enjoyed writing to their friends! In mathematics we have focussed on number recognition and finding missing numbers!

Year1/2

This week Ants, Dragonflies and Bees have been busy learning all about Hanukkah- a Jewish celebration.

We have read recipes, watched cooking clips and made our own delicious potato latkes (a traditional dish to celebrate Hanukkah). We are really getting into the festive spirit with our nativity songs and actions; we can't wait to show it to you in December. Please remember that our PE days are Tuesday and Wednesday and PE kit needs to be in school on these days.

Year 3/4

Across Year 3/4 this term we have been reading George's Marvellous Medicine. We collected information to chair our own class debates to discuss whether Grandma deserved George's marvellous medicine or not. They were extremely persuasive and shared great arguments mixed with facts and opinions. Their argument was so persuasive that many children changed their viewpoints. We believe that we have future politicians in our classes, watch out!

Year 5/6

Another busy week in Phase 3. Year 5 have been solving problems in relation to factors and prime numbers and Year 6 are using BODMAS during maths. English has been a story in context with our text 'Invasion of the Nazis' and our topic work continues with WWII. Our Anderson shelters are fantastic and we applied our teamwork skills to this project. A polite reminder that children should have PE kit in school everyday.
